

## APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE PHILIPPINE BIDDING DOCUMENTS FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS, CIVIL WORKS AND CONSULTING SERVICES EDITION II AS HARMONIZED WITH THE ADB, JBIC AND WORLD BANK PROCUREMENT RULES

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9184 (R.A. 9184), otherwise known as "Government Procurement Reform Act" and its Implementing Rules and Regulations Part A (IRR-A) took effect on January 26, 2003 and October 8, 2003 respectively;

WHEREAS, Section 6 of R.A. 9184 provides for the standardization of the procurement process, including the forms to be used, and that the Government Procurement Policy Board (GPPB) shall pursue the development of generic procurement manuals and standard bidding forms, the use of which once issued shall be mandatory upon all Procuring Entities.

WHEREAS, during the 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the GPPB held on August 20, 2004, the Members of the Board unanimously approved and adopted the Philippine Bidding Documents (PBDs) for Goods and Civil Works, as Harmonized with the Asian Development Bank (ADB), Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC) and World Bank Procurement Rules, and Consulting Services as Harmonized with the World Bank Procurement Rules, dated August 2004, for the mandatory use effective March 1, 2005, through GPPB Resolution No. 10-2004;

**WHEREAS**, during the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the GPPB for the year 2005, held on January 24, 2005, the Members of the Board rescheduled the date imposed for the mandatory use of the PBDs from March 1, 2005 to June 1, 2005, through GPPB Resolution No. 01-2005;

WHEREAS, during the 5<sup>th</sup> meeting of the GPPB for the year 2005, held on May 26, 2005, Edition II of the PBDs for Goods, Civil Works and Consulting Services were presented to the Board incorporating the changes approved by the GPPB through Resolution No. 03-2005 dated January 24, 2005, and other adjustments made by the GPPB-Technical Support Office (TSO) for the improvement of the documents; and

WHEREAS, during the said GPPB meeting, the Members of the Board unanimously approved and adopted the PBDs for Goods and Civil Works Edition II as Harmonized with the ADB, JBIC and World Bank Procurement Rules, and Consulting Services Edition II as harmonized with the World Bank Procurement Rules, and rescheduled the mandatory use of these documents from June 1, 2005 to July 1, 2005 to give government agencies sufficient time to familiarize themselves with the PBDS Edition II.



## RESOLUTION NO. 010-2005

Now, Therefore, for and in consideration of the foregoing, WE, the Members of the Government Procurement Policy Board, by virtue of the powers vested on US by law, hereby RESOLVE to confirm, approve and adopt the "PHILIPPINE BIDDING DOCUMENTS for PROCUREMENT OF GOODS and CIVIL WORKS EDITION II as Harmonized with the ADB, JBIC and WORLD BANK PROCUREMENT RULES, and CONSULTING SERVICES EDITION II as Harmonized with the WORLD BANK PROCUREMENT RULES" dated May 2005.

IN VIEW OF THE ABOVE PREMISES, all branches, agencies, departments, bureaus, offices and instrumentalities of the Government, including government-owned and/or controlled corporations (GOCCs), government financial institutions (GFIs), state universities and colleges (SUCs), and local government units (LGUs), are hereby mandated to use the Philippine Bidding Documents in the preparation of their bidding documents for all of their procurement activities effective July 1, 2005.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.
