Re: Amount of Bid Fees

Dear Atty. Samson:

We respond to your letter dated 29 July 2009, which was received by our office on 19 August 2009, seeking guidance on the determination of the price to be paid for bidding documents, in relation to the bidding being conducted by the Bids and Awards Committere of Samar State University (SSU-BAC).

At the outset, we wish to inform you that the Government Procurement Policy Board ("GPPB") and its Technical Support Office ("TSO") only render policy and non-policy opinions respectively, on issues purely relating to the interpretation and application of our procurement laws, rules and regulations. It has no jurisdiction to rule over actual controversies with regard to the conduct of the bidding since it has no quasi-judicial functions under the law. Thus, it cannot dictate to the BAC how to conduct its bidding and related activities pertinent thereto.

Further, we adhere to the view that the functions of the BAC cannot be interfered with by any government agency since these solely fall within their authority as sanctioned by law, but with the concomitant responsibility that they perform such functions with judiciousness, adhering to the principles of transparency, accountability, competition, equity, efficiency, and economy in the procurement process that it carries out for the procuring entity.

In view of the foregoing, and considering that the circular/guidelines on the amount of bid fees has yet to be issued by the GPPB, we cannot dictate to the SSUBAC how they should compute the same. Nonetheless, we opine that the amount to be

¹ Quasi-judicial is defined as the term applied to the actions or discretions of public administrative officers or bodies required to investigate facts, or ascertain the existence of facts, hold hearings, and draw conclusions from them, as a basis for their official action and to exercise discretion of a judicial nature. required by the BAC should be reasonable and duly consider the procurement principles espoused above.

We trust that this sufficiently addresses your concern.



Dear Sir/Madam;

I write in behalf of my client, Prince Valiant Int'l. Corporation.

On June 22, 2009, the Samar State University (SSU) published an invitation to Apply for Eligibility and to Bid for the Purchase of Mechatronics Equipment-Pneumatic Training System for the College of Engineering with an Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) of Four Million Twenty Thousand Pesos (Php 4,020,000.00) and a Forty Thousand Two Hundred Pesos (Php 40,200.00) price for the bid documents.

My client, Prince Valiant Int'l Corporation, is interested in participating in the said bidding process but is anxious because of the price of the bidding documents which is equivalent to one per cent (1%) of the Approved Budget Contract. On July 15, 2009 in behalf of my client, I wrote a letter to the BAC Chairman of Samar State University inquiring as to the legal basis for the imposed fee on the bid documents. A letter reply was received on July 20, 2009 dated July 16, 2009 stating that the non-refundable fee imposed on the purchase of bid documents is One Per Cent (1%) of the ABC which is patterned after the fees requirements laid down in Rules V, VI and VII of the IRR-A of RA 9184, and DBM Budget Circular 2004-5A date October 7, 2005 which, upon careful review of the said Rules and Circular, the said rules did not mention any standard for the imposition of fees for the bid documents. Furthermore, the DBM Circular that was stated in the reply letter from the SSU-BAC refers to the Guidelines on the Grant of Honoraria to Government Personnel involved in Government Procurement which in itself is explanatory, and which does not at all include the standard for the imposition of fees for bidding documents.

In this connection, I am writing to you in behalf of my client, Prince Valiant Int'l. Corporation represented by its president Mr. Demetrio M. Estellero, Jr. expressing our concerns about the fee for the purchase of bid documents which to us may be excessive considering that the purpose of the said fee is for the cost of preparation of the bidding documents only. The excessive and non-refundable costs of bidding documents may possibly lead to speculations that the institution or agency concerned may have a hidden intent of discouraging legitimate bidders to participate in the public bidding, in favor of a few, and which would be inimical to the basic principles of R.A. 9184. Furthermore, may we

Dear Counsel Sanson:

This refers to your letter dated July 6, 2009 in behalf of your client Prince Valiant Int'l. Corporation represented by Mr. Demetrio M. Estellero, Jr. and received by the undersigned on July 15, 2009 inquiring as to the legal basis in imposing the amount of PhP 40,200.00 as non-refundable fee in purchasing the complete set of bidding documents for the purchase by public bidding of Mechatronics – Pneumatic Training System (Phase 1) by Samar State University.

We are pleased to learn of your client's interest to participate in the public bidding of the aforesaid equipment and we wish to assure your client that the preparation, development and conduct of the public bidding for the purchase of the particular equipment are all geared towards attaining competitive bidding as articulated in Republic Act 9184. The price for the complete set of eligibility and bid documents is not intended to discourage legitimate and qualified business entities but rather to dissuade from participating "fly-by-night" and opportunistic suppliers who may buy the bidding documents but would not proceed to submit their bids and instead muddle the bid process.

The non-refundable fee for the eligibility and bidding documents which constitutes 1% of the Approved Budget for the Contract and is patterned after the fee requirement under Rule XVII of RA 9184, covers not only the cost of preparing and developing the bidding documents but also those of the eligibility documents including the fees required for the publication of the invitation to bid and other entitlements allowed by RA 9184 and DBM relative to the procurement project.

As to your query, the price for the eligibility and bid documents was set by the SSU Bid and Awards Committee (BAC) in accordance with Rules V, VI, and VII of the IRR-A of RA 9184, and DBM Budget Circular 2004-5A dated October 7, 2005.
